Each local commercial station in the UK has obligations with regard to its programmes, including its music and local content. These obligations are set out in the station Format which forms part of this station's Public File.

The Public File is also available in hard copy by post upon request by any member of the public, and serves as one indicator of each station's output. Comment on the contents of the Public File should be made to the station or to the industry regulator, Ofcom.

The services we operate

Nation Radio Investments Limited holds separate analogue licenses covering Dumbarton and Helensburgh. All programming is 100% shared between the services and therefore this document covers both licenses. This public file is required under these licences.

Until 31 March 2020 the service was transmitted on the Glasgow Trial DAB multiplex.

The service continues to broadcast online.

Emergency measures – Statement 1 April 2020

During these unprecedented times we've have made some changes from 1 April 2020 to programming on our radio stations in the light of changing resourcing availability and income.

In the case of Your Radio we felt that in order to provide a continued service of music, news and entertainment to listeners Dumbarton and Helensburgh it was a better use of our resources to relay Nation Radio Scotland on a temporary basis.

Advertisers on Your Radio and Nation Radio will cover a wider area as a result and we can continue to maintain peak time programming and relevant local and national news for listeners.

We've kept Ofcom fully informed of the steps we are taking and will review the situation regularly in light of the continuing UK emergency situation.

Our FM transmitters will continue to display YOUR RADIO and we are not altering RDS codes at this time as this is intended to be a temporary measure.

News Bulletin schedule

What our format says...

At least hourly during peaktime weekdays and weekends.
At other times UK-wide, nations and international news should feature

What we deliver....

Nation Radio Scotland has expanded its editorial area to provide local news for Helensburgh and Dumbarton during this emergency period.

We deliver a news bulletin covering World, UK, National and local news (for West Central Scotland, Helensburgh and Dumbarton) to the following schedule:

Weekdays
0600 to 1900 inclusive every hour

Weekends
Bulletins – 0800-1200 inclusive every hour

We therefore exceed the requirement of the format in relation to local news delivery.

Recent news stories covered on air

The news and content team

News resourcing across the group is supplemented by members of the programming and commercial teams based within the area who are also able to collect content as appropriate.

Nation Broadcasting's news is compiled utilising journalistic support based in Leeds.

The programme schedule

The programme schedule is available on the website yourradio.scot which currently forwards to nationradio.scot.

The average number of hours of automated programming within weekday daytimes and within daytimes on Saturdays and Sundays

We make full use of broadcast playout technology in order to deliver our programmes and free up presentation staff to produce content.

All programming is automated under the definition used by Ofcom.

Whilst our programming is automated under the definition published by Ofcom; relevant programme links (especially at peaktimes) are typically pre-recorded on the day of transmission shortly before transmission.

The amount of local programming per day produced by the station

At least 10 hours a day during daytime weekdays (must include breakfast).

At least 4 hours during daytime on Saturdays and Sundays.

All presented programming is delivered by main presenters located within the licensed area of Nation Radio / Your Radio at the time of transmission.

Some programming items such as news and travel may be compiled by presenters physically located outside of the station's licensed area.

Shared programming and content

As an emergency measure, Nation Radio Scotland's programming is currently shared with Your Radio (Helensburgh) and Your Radio (Dumbarton). This arrangement commenced on 1 April 2020 and is under review.
